

JAMES CONE'S DEFINITION OF THE CHURCH

"The people of God, whose primary task is that of being Christ to the world by proclaiming the message of the gospel (kerygma), by rendering services of liberation (diakonia), and by being itself a manifestation of the nature of the new society (koinonia)."

Problematic Models of Church Membership

- 1. Membership is about **PERKS**.
- 2. Membership is about **PRIVILEGES**.
- 3. Membership is about OTHERS SERVING ME.
- 4. Membership is about MY PREFERENCES TAKING PRECEDENT.
- 5. Membership is about <u>LEADERSHIP</u> CONFORMING TO MY DESIRES.
- 6. Membership is about **LONGEVITY DETERMINING VALUE**.

Today's Truth Nugget

Church membership will be a problem whenever it is focused on receiving instead of giving, being served instead of serving, rights without responsibilities, and entitlement without sacrifices.


- 1. Witness-hindering Scandal (1 Cor. 5:15-13)

1. A FUNCTIONING MEMBER KNOWS THAT WE ARE ALL **NECESSARY PARTS** OF THE WHOLE -1 CORINTHIANS 12:12, 12:27-28



1 CORINTHIANS 12:12; 12:27-28

1 CORINTHIANS 12:12

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.

1 CORINTHIANS 12:27-28

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. ²⁸ And God has appointed in the church first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then deeds of power, then gifts of healing, forms of assistance, forms of leadership, various kinds of tongues.

2. A FUNCTIONING **MEMBER KNOWS OUR DIFFERENCES ARE STRENGTHS NOT LIABILITIES** — 1 CORINTHIANS 12:14-18



1 CORINTHIANS 12:14-18

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. ¹⁵ If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁷ If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? ¹⁸ But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose.

3. A FUCNTIONING MEMBER GIVES THEIR BEST REGULARLY— 1 CORINTHIANS 12:26

1 CORINTHIANS 12:26

If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it.



4. A FUNCTIONING MEMBER KNOWS, TRUSTS, AND OPERATES FROM THEIR OWN GIFTS – 1 CORINTHIANS 12:27



CORINTHIANS 12:27

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.



1 CORINTHIANS 12:24b-25

But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, ²⁵ that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another.

TAKE THE PLEDGE:

I AM A CHURCH MEMBER.

I LIKE THE METAPHOR OF MEMBERSHIP. IT'S NOT MEMBERSHIP AS IN A CIVIC ORGANIZATION OR A COUNTRY CLUB. IT'S THE KIND OF MEMBERSHIP GIVEN TO US IN 1 CORINTHIANS 12: "NOW YOU ARE THE BODY OF CHRIST, AND INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS OF IT (1 COR. 12:27).

TAKE THE PLEDGE:

BECAUSE I AM A MEMBER OF THE BODY OF CHRIST, I MUST BE A FUNCTIONING MEMBER, WHETHER I AM AN "EYE," AN "EAR," OR A "HAND." AS A FUNCTIONING MEMBER, I WILL GIVE. I WILL SERVE. I WILL MINISTER. I WILL EVANGELIZE. I WILL STUDY. I WILL SEEK TO BE A BLESSING TO OTHERS. I WILL REMEMBER THAT "IF ONE SUFFERS, ALL THE MEMBERS SUFFER WITH IT; IF ONE MEMBER IS HONORED, ALL MEMBERS REJOICE WITH IT" (1 COR. 12:26).
